On October 19, 1781, the decisive military campaign of the American Revolution culminated with the British surrender to combined American and French forces under the command of George Washington. The siege of Yorktown effectively ended the six-year struggle of the Revolutionary War and set the stage for a new government and nation.

Paul E. Westlake of Westlake Reed Leskosky, was heavily involved in the design and development of the “Victory Center” and will speak to us concerning the project and its finished product. He received a Bachelor of Arts, *Cum Laude with Distinction in Architecture*, from the University of Pennsylvania and a Bachelor of Science in Economics, *Magna Cum Laude* from the Wharton School, with a major in finance. He also received a Masters of Architecture with Faculty Commendation from Harvard University Graduate School of Design

Mr. Westlake is a recipient of over 150 significant design awards. His designs encompass a range of widely exhibited and published projects – from major performing arts facilities and health care complexes, to historic restorations, courthouses, educational and financial institutions. Some of his significant projects include, the Cleveland Museum of Art, Cleveland Museum of Natural History, Cleveland Clinic, Federal Reserve Bank, John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, the Museum of Jewish Heritage in Cleveland and the New Idea Center for the Playhouse Square Arts Education Center. He has worked on more than 200 National Register Landmarks across the United States.
