GENERAL INFORMATION

Registration

Please contact the Religious Education Office to register a new student. All families wishing to register their children in the Parish School of Religion (PSR) and Junior Youth Ministry (JYM) Program must first be registered with the parish. PSR/JYM Registration packets will be mailed in May of each year to families of returning students. Registration packets consist of: a cover letter, Registration Form (one per family) and an Emergency Medical Authorization Form (one for each child).

Fees

The fee for the 2009-2010 PSR/JYM Program is \$60.00 per student. There is an additional Sacramental Fee for grades 2 and 8 of \$25.00 per student and an additional Bible Fee for grade 5 of \$10.00 per student. All fees are payable before the first PSR/JYM session, however, no child will be denied a place in the program due to financial difficulty. Please contact the Religious Education Office if you have questions or concerns regarding fees.

Textbooks

Children from grades Kindergarten thru 8 will be issued a student workbook the first session of PSR/JYM. JYM grades 7 and 8 students will be issued additional materials from the "Discovering Program" (Gr. 7) and the "Gifted With The Spirit" Confirmation Program (Gr. 8). Each child in grade 5 will be given a personal St. Joseph Edition of the New American Bible. Grades 7 and 8 will be loaned a copy of the NAB Catholic Youth Bible.

Parental Involvement

Parent volunteers are always needed in various areas of our Religious Education and Youth Ministry Programs. If you are interested in becoming a catechist, substitute catechist, classroom aid, hall monitor or adult table leader (JYM grades 7 & 8), please contact the Religious education Office or meet with Mary Reboudo during PSR. All adult volunteers are required to complete the VIRTUS Program (Protecting God's Children) and have current fingerprinting and background check on file in the Religious Education Office.

As parents, you are the primary teachers of your children, and family faith formation is essential for spiritual growth. Participation in Mass and PSR/JYM sessions is also an important part of your child's on-going faith development. Please make an effort to attend regularly. It is also important to take time each week to review with your child any materials that are sent home. Materials may include: important memos, lessons and the *Sharing Faith with My Family* page at the end of each chapter. This is a great way to reinforce concepts covered in class and stay informed as parents. In the event

that your child is absent from a scheduled class, please ask the catechist for lessons missed so that they can be completed at home.

Parents should familiarize themselves with these PSR/JYM guidelines, and refer to the event schedules beginning on page 9 of this handbook. Additional notices will be sent home on occasion. Important PSR/JYM updates will be included in the PSR/JYM Newsletter which is sent home once a month and the St. Victor Parish Bulletin. The Parish Bulletin can be picked up in church on the weekend, and is also posted on the parish website at <http://home.roadrunner.com/~stvictor>.

Student Involvement

Students benefit greatly by actively participating in scheduled PSR/JYM sessions, liturgies, Children's Liturgy of the Word, Church social events and service projects. Each child is blessed with special gifts and should be encouraged to share them with the Parish Community.

All students are expected to be courteous and respectful toward teachers and other students at all times. Each catechist will set behavioral guidelines for his or her classroom which students will be expected to follow. Parents will be notified of any behavioral problems that cannot be resolved in the classroom. Students are also expected to respect the property of Revere Middle School.

Entrance and Dismissal Procedure

Students in grades K – 8 are to enter and leave Revere Middle School via the main entrance. Classes begin at 9:45 am and end at 11:15 am. Please do not drop students off prior to 9:30 am. Please pick students up promptly when class is over. Kindergarten parents are asked to come into the building to pick up their child(ren) to assure their safety. If it is necessary for a child to leave PSR/JYM early, a signed note from the parent or guardian must be given to the PSR/JYM teacher or Mrs. Reboudo, and the child will be dismissed at the appropriate time. For the safety of children that are leaving early, parents are asked to come into the school and sign them out. In order to keep everyone safe and traffic moving during drop-off and pick-up of students on Sunday morning, please follow these guidelines:

- When stopping to drop-off or pick-up students, use the curb lane only, keeping the area directly in front of the building entrance open so that there is a clear path for pedestrians.
- Please do not stop or park in the lane between the parking area of the lot and curb lane as this is a safety hazard for the children and stops traffic from flowing freely. Also, those parked cannot pull out with a whole lane of cars stopped behind them.

Following these guidelines should help make drop-off and pick-up of students go more quickly and safely.

PSR/JYM Cancellation

In the event that PSR/JYM is cancelled due to inclement weather, power failures, or any other unforeseen reason, families will be notified by phone and an announcement will be made at the 8:45 Mass. The cancellation will also be posted with I-Alert. I-Alert is a free service, operated by WKYC-TV and WTAM-AM. Its intent is to improve the closing and delay process by allowing schools to reach several media outlets with one call. With the addition of I-Alert, there will be less of a chance that a family is not contacted. We will do our best to make sure that all families are contacted when there is a cancellation.

CURRICULUM

St. Victor Parish School of Religion and Youth Ministry is dedicated to partnering with the families of our parish community as they strive to enrich the faith life of their children and young teens. The Parish School of Religion and Youth Ministry Program will support these efforts by providing a quality religious education for the children and teens of our parish, rich in the faith and traditions of the Roman Catholic Church. Our parish staff and volunteers are committed to sharing the message of the Gospel through Christian example, prayer study and service. It is our hope that together we can build a strong foundation for our families, one that will inspire a deeper love for the Lord and continued growth in the knowledge and practice of our Catholic faith.

Pre-School

Our Pre-School program, “I Am Special” (Age 4) by Our Sunday Visitor, is taught by Miss Diane Nagy. This religious-education program is designed to help young children at the preschool level to discover their special qualities and importance in God’s creation. The primary focus of the program is to assist them in developing positive self-concepts through awareness that God has made each of them very special. Their positive self-concepts are supportive foundations for developing the Christian attitudes of loving, helping, sharing, and also for developing a relationship with a loving God.

“I Am Special” provides learning experiences based on the preschool child’s level of understanding and ability to participate. Through the media of stories, songs, finger plays, games, dramatizations, lesson-related prayer, and sensorial activities, children can sense God’s love for them. Above all, a pleasant relationship between teacher and children in a religion class not only exemplifies God’s love but also aids the children in forming patterns of social behavior and Christian attitudes toward others.

Grades K through 6

Our program for grades Kindergarten through 6 is “We Believe” published by Sadlier. The Sadlier “We Believe” Program addresses the needs of the child, the family, the catechist, and the Church community through:

- Content that is faithful to the teachings of the Catholic Church and that holistically embraces the four pillars of the Catechism: Creed, Liturgy and Sacraments, Moral Life, Prayer;
- Reliance on Scripture, Catholic social teaching, vocation awareness, and mission;
- Music and prayer which echo and anticipate liturgical celebrations;
- Methodologies that engage the experience of the child, modeled on Jesus’ “pedagogy of faith”;
- Reflection and activities which integrate catechesis, liturgy, and life;
- Media and technology used in service to faith and in the context of family;
- Review and assessment which reinforce the essential content of the lesson;
- Reflections and activities which involve the children and their families in catechesis, prayer, and life.

Each chapter includes a *Sharing Faith with My Family* page to be completed at home. These family pages invite participation in each chapter through prayer, activities, information and review. Activities and discussions on these pages are student-initiated, inviting the student to be the evangelizer. Families will also have access to the program Web site www.webelieveweb.com, where they will find safe web activities for children and family-based faith activities to share.

Junior Youth Ministry (JYM) Grades 7 and 8

Our program for grades 7 and 8 is “We Live Our Faith” published by Sadlier. The student text enables today’s adolescents to get involved in learning and living their faith.

Grade 7 will use Volume I: We Live Our Faith As Disciples of Jesus which centers on Jesus’ life, his teachings, and the sacraments he instituted. It presents Jesus’ call to each person to become his disciple and the ways in which his teachings, his sacraments, and his Church nourish people for discipleship. The “Discovering Program” Topic: “Growing Up Sexually” published by St. Mary’s Press will be integrated into the grade 7 curriculum.

Grade 8 will use Volume II: We Live Our Faith As Members of the Church which presents the Church from its beginning at the Pentecost event through its history, encompassing its teachings and tradition. It presents the mission of the Church, entrusted to her by Jesus, as the responsibility of all baptized Catholics. Confirmation “Gifted With The Spirit” published by Pflaum will be integrated into the grade 8 curriculum.

Children’s Liturgy of the Word (CLW)

Children’s Liturgy of the Word is celebrated on Sunday at either the 8:45 or 11:30 Mass during the PSR/JYM year. Liturgy of the Word with Children is a worship experience geared especially for children (ages 4-9). It mirrors the worship experience of the larger community, with a style that is engaging and interactive. Liturgy of the Word with Children offers an experience for the children to hear the Scriptures in words they understand and to share their own understanding of God’s word. Teams of catechists, parents and teens lead the children in CLW in the Gathering Room during a Sunday morning Mass. There is a CLW schedule posted in the Gathering Room. If you are interested in participating in CLW, please sign up when the schedule is announced and posted. Please check the bulletin for your scheduled date and time of Mass.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

First Reconciliation (Penance) – Second Grade

As a parent of a child who is preparing to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time, you are invited to experience with your child the gifts of joy, peace, forgiveness and new life that God offers through Jesus in this sacrament. It is through you that your child learns to relate to God and others. Your example of being open to receiving the Sacrament of Reconciliation yourself will help your child value the gift of God's forgiveness.

Catechists will use unit two of the "We Believe" Program to prepare grade two students for the Sacrament of Reconciliation. The chapters in unit two will be used to help the children appreciate the wonderful gift of God's forgiveness. Children will be learning the Ten Commandments and the Beatitudes to use for an examination of conscience before confession and a prayer of sorrow to be said during confession.

Children preparing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation for the first time will meet at the church to view the confessional with Fr. Corrigan. At this time, Fr. Corrigan will also walk the children through the Rite of Reconciliation and allow them to practice. Please see the Second Grade Sacramental Schedule and the PSR/JYM Schedule for dates and times of First Penance, parent meetings and special events.

First Communion (Eucharist) – Second Grade

Through the Sacrament of Baptism, your child was welcomed to new life in God's family. Just as Baptism began your child's initiation in the faith, preparing for First Eucharist continues this process as your child matures and grows in understanding and relationship with God, your family and the world. Through lessons in the "We Believe" text, children will gain an awareness that the Eucharist, under the appearances of bread and wine, is the real Body and Blood of Christ. They will gain a basic understanding that at Mass we praise and thank God for his goodness.

Catechists will use unit three of the "We Believe" Program to prepare grade two students for the Sacrament of First Communion after they receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation. Parents can help their children prepare for the Sacrament of Eucharist by encouraging them to participate actively in the celebration of the Mass. Catechists will explain to the children the guidelines about receiving Holy Communion and demonstrate correctly to them how Communion should be received.

Children preparing to receive the Sacrament of Eucharist for the first time will meet with Fr. Corrigan in the church to practice. Fr. Corrigan will walk them through the celebration of First Eucharist and, with written parental permission, allow them to sample an unconsecrated host and some wine. Please see the Second Grade Sacramental Schedule and the PSR/JYM Schedules for dates and times of the Sacrament of First Communion, parent meetings and special events.

As in past years, a professional videographer will record the First Communion, and copies will be made available for an additional fee.

Confirmation – Eighth Grade

The Sacrament of Confirmation is one of the three Sacraments of Initiation – Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. The word initiation refers to the formal process of joining an organization or a chosen way of life. Together these three Sacraments initiate Catholics into an ever growing relationship with Christ and his Church.

Through Baptism, we are reborn as we receive the grace of the Holy Spirit for the first time. We are born to a new life in faith. Confirmation completes the grace of Baptism. In Confirmation we receive a special strengthening of the Holy Spirit, which seals or perfects the grace of Baptism. Confirmation, as it is in Baptism, is so powerful that it imprints us with a special spiritual mark, or character. That is why Confirmation, like Baptism, can be received only once.

Parents can help their children prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation by encouraging them to participate actively in scheduled JYM and Confirmation sessions, retreats, liturgies and special events. Please encourage your child to participate actively in the following: Family Night-Making Blankets (in the church hall), Advent Family Workshop and Dinner, Thanksgiving Mass, JYM Bake Sale, JYM Ash Wednesday Soup Supper, Communal Penance Service, and Confirmation Retreat. Please see the Eighth Grade Sacramental Schedule and PSR/JYM Schedule for the dates and times of the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation, JYM and Confirmation Sessions, parent meetings, Confirmation Retreat, liturgies and special events.

Each Confirmation candidate is asked to volunteer their time at Regina Health Center and participate with a parent or another adult in Children's Liturgy of the Word at least one time. There are sign-up sheets in the Gathering Room for service at Regina and Children's Liturgy of the Word. There will be a Confirmation Family Faith Sharing Evening and Practice in the Church Hall which all candidates, parents and sponsors are required to attend.

The date and time of confirmation is set by the Chancery Office of the Diocese of Cleveland. Although we are able state our preferences for the date and time of Confirmation, there is no assurance that our requests can be honored.
